HARMONY HOUSE AND THE WELL: During the month of May, the Mission and Outreach Committee will be collecting donations for two women's support organizations, Harmony House and The Well. Harmony House is a safe house for abused women and their families. The Well is a drop in center for women living on the street and those with ODSP disabilities. BUILD A CHURCH": St. Timothy's is embarking on another urgent repair project and is again asking the congregation for financial assistance. As announced last Sunday, removal of the asbestos from the front halls is essential to protect the health of all persons meeting at the church. The cost of this project is estimated to be in the neighborhood of \$5,500. To assist in raising the necessary funds, your Stewardship Committee has placed a "model" church on the table in the Narthex to receive freewill offerings, to be used exclusively for this project. The Session and Board wishes to thank everyone, in advance, for contributions, large or small.

THE SEARCH COMMITTEE will be administering a survey to the congregation on May 28th. The purpose of the survey is to collect data about the congregation which will assist in the recruitment of a new Minister. For anyone who misses the survey on May 28 a second survey will be administered on June 4. Although people may take the survey home with them, think about the questions and return it if they wish, it is hoped that members will simply fill out the document and return it at the end of the service. 15 minutes at the end of the service will be devoted to this task.
