SCHOOL KITS FOR KI DS: Last year's Lenten Mission Project, School Kits for Kids, was so successful, we decided to repeat it: provide school supplies to **100 children** in the region of Kananga City in the Democratic Republic of Congo. For **\$20, you can give a child a school kit**. We would again be working with Diku-Dilenga (<u>www.diku-dilenga.org</u>), a non-governmental organization, founded and directed by our very own Rev. Albert Twambe, and the Tshitoko Presbytery in Kananga City (Rev. Tambwe's home church in D.R. of Congo) The fundraising for this effort will run during Lent, beginning March 10 and ending April 14. Envelopes marked "School Kits for Kids" are available in the pews and in the Narthex and can be placed in the collection plate when making your donations. We are repeating this project because last year's project was so successful, there was enough money to also provide a partial tuition payment for all 100 students; some families used the savings to finance an income-generating venture, thus benefitting the entire family. The project coordinators used this opportunity to evangelise and saw an increase in attendance at church. Finally, the project caught the attention of the World Bank which has selected one of the schools for reconstruction. Like the fishes and the loaves, God multiplied our gifts! Praise God!
