Minister's Corner

Hummus and cheese theology! It was a special day at Riverview Presbyterian Church in Iroquois, Ontario, where I was serving at the time. I met with a few ladies from the church to teach them how to make homemade feta cheese and hummus. We spent a couple of hours talking, laughing and learning. At one point, I wondered: if Jesus were to come into the church during that cooking session, what would he do? Would he tell us: let's all go to the sanctuary I have something to teach you? Or would he just join us for some hummus and cheese?

The gospel story told by the four evangelists is only the tip of the iceberg compared to what Jesus said and did (see John 21: 25). They had to be short and concise in relaying the good news to their hearers and readers. We know for a fact that Jesus did not only teach his disciples and do signs and miracles in their presence, he actually lived with them; they must have talked, laughed, cried and cooked together. This is exactly what we were doing on that special day, and I would venture to say that this is what helped turn a group of 12 young men, most of them total strangers, into a community. In Jesus, God did not reveal himself to us in stone tablets or by the words of another prophet or messenger, but in person, in his own person (see Hebrews 1: 1-3). If God's eternal choice is to come to us and meet us face to face in Jesus, then creating a loving and caring community must be on his bucket list.

St. Tim's is going to open its own coffee shop in the near future, where people of all walks of life are invited to come and spend time together. This is not another 'cool thing' we're doing. It is a true reflection of who we are and what we're called to be and do. We want to help create a loving and caring community. Hopefully, those who show up will find a listening ear and a smiling friend. Sometimes, all we need is just one person to hear about our experiences in life and how we like to paint it in words. Life makes sense when we share our story with others. Faith is not only words and truths that we embrace; faith is a living thing.
