Minister's Corner

Almost every piece of written communication I have received in the last two weeks, as the world is unified in its battle against Covid-19, ends with a warm wish like: stay healthy, keep safe, stay positive, be strong.

I appreciate every one of those phrases and the good intentions behind them. But I can't help but think, that should the worst hit us here in Canada, like in Italy and Spain, those phrases won't carry us far. They will not help our world stay together and not collapse. In every tough situation, besides the practical measures we need to implement, we need some kind of spiritual and/or intellectual framework or glue to keep all the pieces together so we can stay whole and not crumble. At this point, it would be easy to suggest a few Biblical verses to highlight God's faithfulness and nearness; but I will not do this. Why? Because the Biblical testimonies, in tough times, take a different route. When things become really bad, unbearable, and the worst fears come true, and because faith is concrete and original, we see people lamenting and grieving. Almost one third of the Book of Psalms, is designated to personal and group lamentation. Lamenting is our human way to say: we are not in control, we can't win and, we can't understand why this is happening. Hear the psalmist say: O Lord, You have seen it; do not be silent. O Lord, be not far from me (Psalm 35:22). And in Psalm 22:1: My God, my God, why have You forsaken me? Why are You so far from saving me, so far from my words of groaning? Of course, we remember these words spoken by Jesus on the cross. N.T. Right says: 'The mystery of the Biblical story is that God also laments.'

As long as we are on this earth, regardless of our power or knowledge, we still need a shoulder to cry on from time to time. God doesn't only give us encouragement in tough times, but he also lends us a shoulder to cry on. So, I pray you stay safe, and that you find God's shoulder to cry on when you need it. Rev. Reine
