Minister's Corner

Jeremiah 18:6 O house of Israel, cannot I do with you as this potter? saith the Lord. Behold, as the clay is in the potter's hand, so are ye in mine hand, O house of Israel.

During a pre-marital counselling session, the counsellor showed the couple a picture of a potter-house and asked them to identify with one element in the picture. The picture contained three elements: the potter, the wheel and clay. After a time, both said: "the wheel". Generally, we may be too polite to express our wish to be the potter, but we are defiantly against being the clay.

In the beginning, this picture of the potter sitting behind his wheel forming and creating a useful pot or beautiful vase was inside the mind and soul of each of us. We saw our life in the hands of The One who is ultimately knowing, able and loving. Before we went to sleep, we put our thoughts and concerns in his palms. As we left our houses in the morning, we asked him for guidance. When fear and sadness hit, we ran to him for help. We lived in the world of the Great Potter.

Gradually, things changed. There is a growing desire to be the potter of our life. We love the idea of creating something useful and beautiful out of a messy chunk of clay. We want to believe that what happens to this clay can happen to anything that comes our way. We are creative, smart, enthusiastic and can build something new almost every day; so why not to see ourselves as great potters?

Since we uncovered the laws of our world, and learned to control them, we want nothing to do with clay. We feel that we've been there too long and we've paid our dues. When we look at all that has been achieved in the fields of science and technology, we are more convinced that it is right to claim the seat of the potter.

But did we actually gain anything from this change? Do we have a better sense of meaning and purpose in our life? In a world filled with trouble and pain, it doesn't take much to realise that we are NOT in control. 
