Minister's Corner

Keep Awake. During Advent, we are reminded that Jesus calls on us to keep awake. When we read Mark 13:28-29: "From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things [destruction and unfortunate events] taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates", we call on our matching skills to understand our place in relation to the day of the coming of the Lord, so that we may know what to do. We start to go over the deplorable and unfortunate events taking place in our world and tie them to what the Bible is teaching us about the end times.

But Jesus openly and plainly said: "But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." (Mark 13:32). That should put the matter to rest. Any speculation about when or where or how is not in line with Jesus' teaching. Our vigilance and watchfulness don't come from our matching skills. Rather, our alertness and attention come from the fact that Jesus asked us to "Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come." (Mark 13:33). When you read Mark 13:24-37, you don't need your matching skills, all you really need are "good knees". Don't bring your matching skills to this text, bring your knees (and maybe your arthritis pills).

"Keep awake" evokes our ability to wait prayerfully and to not predict! The Advent season: a time of prayerful waiting. We are waiting for the consummation of time. We are waiting for the coming of the Lord. And when we are saying these things, we are saying that we are waiting for all the Biblical promises to come true. They are what gives our life meaning and purpose: we are waiting to be filled with the spirit and to meet the ones who have gone ahead of us. We are waiting for our wounds to be healed and for the end of all grudges, misunderstanding and lack of communication. We are waiting for our needs to be fulfilled and for our weaknesses to be perfected. We are waiting to meet Jesus in person. And in the meanwhile, we pray: we pray for deeper faith; we pray for better understanding of what's going on around us; we pray for our hopes to come true. Happy Advent. Rev. Reine
