Congratulations to you all on achieving the goal of St. Timothy's Mission & Outreach project to support the 'SEMOH- empowering women in Cameroon'. 50 women are now able to become providers for their families by starting a small business and having their own income. Yes, by the help of God, we did it.

St. Timothy's Community Garden The concept of a vegetable garden on the front lawn of the church was first discussed in 2016, and one garden plot was dug that year. One-third of the produce was donated to the Heron Emergency Food Centre, thus launching a community mission project which has continued each year. By 2018 the gardens had grown to six plots, and in 2021 three more plots were added for a total of nine. Currently, eight of the plots are rented by church families and community members, with the ninth being used to grow potatoes for HEFC. Rental fees cover the costs of tilling, compost, and water. The Mission and Outreach Committee of St. Timothy's is responsible for the operation of the gardens. In addition, the gardens are registered with Just Food, the organization which coordinates the network of community gardens throughout Ottawa. St. Timothy's Garden is also a visible presence in the community, visited by numerous local residents. This year has been declared "The Year of the Garden," a good time to reflect on the value of gardens of all kinds as providers of food for the body and the soul.

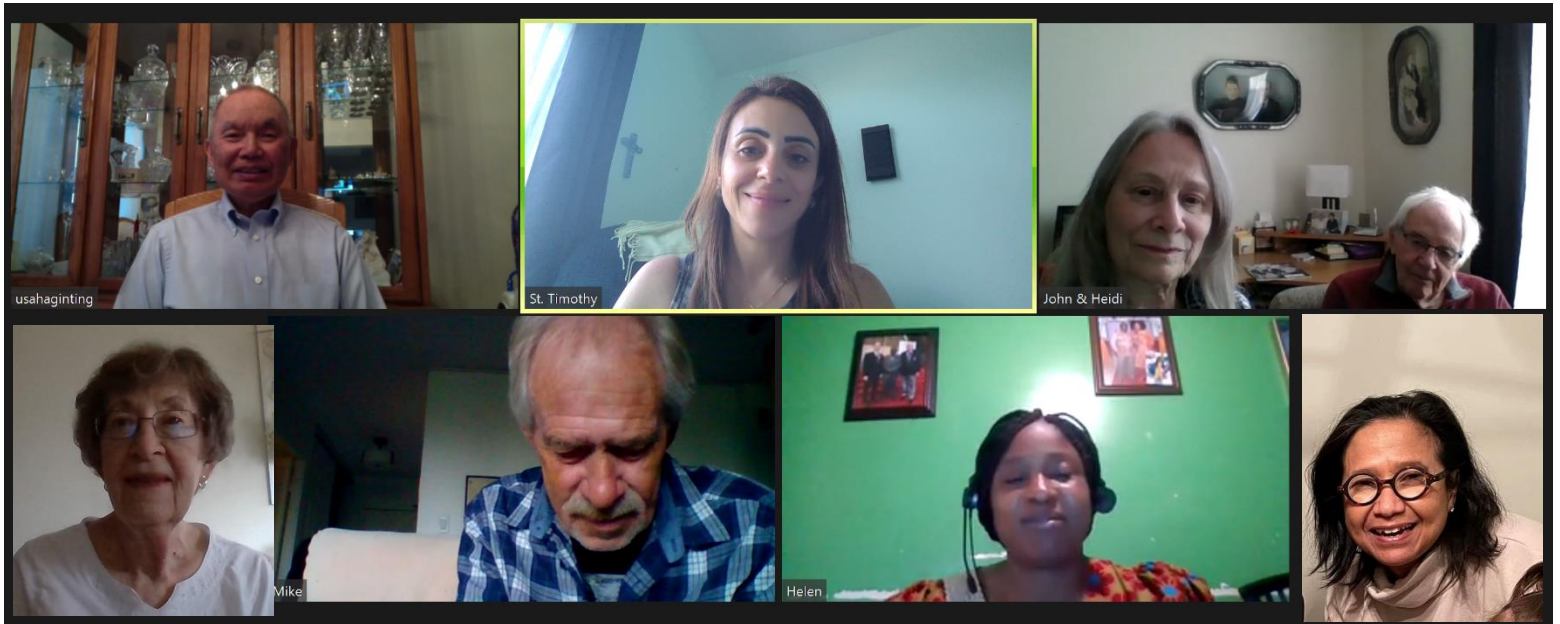
