Minister's Corner We ask questions all the time. They are the best way to go from what we know to what we don't know. They are our ultimate tool to explore what's around us. We approach life with questions; this is how we learn new things. Our questions are behind the pleasure of finding things out.

They are behind the "aha" moments in our life. But, what kind of questions do we usually ask, is there a pattern to them? We ask questions because we are inquisitive. Learning is usually a fun experience. Asking questions & learning things allow us to explore what we like. Our most interesting questions are about the stuff we like the most. It is funny that our favorite question is: "What's for dinner tonight?", but it is a direct application of the fact that our points of interest create most of our questions. Most of our daily questions are in the same line of "What's for dinner tonight?" what to eat, what to drink, what to wear, where to live, what to drive, how to invest & so on. Jesus was very particular about asking this kind of question; He said: "Do not be anxious, therefore, asking 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' Interestingly, he didn't say "Don't ask these questions", Jesus said: don't be anxious asking these questions. Do you remember his words to Martha: "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things." Asking the wrong questions will lead to distraction and engaging life on a superficial level. When we have Jesus in our lives, then we will have a change in the profoundness of our questions. When we realize that there is a whole different realm in this life past the sensory one, we start to want to engage life on that deeper level. This is exactly what it's all about; it's about asking the right questions & approaching life with bigger questions, so we learn the important & enduring meaning of life. It is about finding the biggest "aha" moment in life, the most fulfilling & inspiring moment which leads to change, not only a short-lived one, but a profound and enduring change. Rev. Reine.
