Minister's Corner: Jimmy is the nicest person you can ever meet. He likes to listen to classical music and does not like anything to disturb his life routine. He loves to have his meals on time & you can set your watch on his coffee time in the morning & tea time in the afternoon. Though he does not do any gardening, he has a little plant that has been sitting in his front porch for as long as he can remember. Its size stays the same, but every spring a beautiful white flower opens & stays until mid-summer, which he loved. However recently, Jim realized that the plant was not doing very well; it didn't look healthy. After a couple of days, he decided to take it inside & look after it. But much to his dismay that did not help at all. Jimmy started to panic & finally decided to ask an older lady who lives next door. She told him 'This plant is an outdoors one & you did not do her any favor taking it inside. Sometimes weather can be tough, but still, it is better for this kind to stay out. It might survive inside, but it will never thrive.' It is not a secret that the church is not blooming as before. Culture & society, in many different parts of the world, seem to have turned against religion in general for many different reasons. As a result, we have decided to "take it inside". When this beautiful plant was not doing well outside, we figured out that we better take it in & nurse it. Since then, we have set the church on survival mode; fear dictated what we do & how we do it. This meant that very little experimenting took place & we learned almost nothing on how to relate to the new culture that surrounded us. Inside our own world we kept the routine we are used to & listened to the music we love, but the world around us is changing all the time. The gospel has always been an outdoors plant. When Jesus said: "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head." (Luke 9:58) he meant every letter of it. He was trying to tell those who wish to follow him that the message they will carry is meant to endure whatever tomorrow brings on it. Every day in His mission was a new day: He did not have regular audience; anyone who came to listen was one of His; He did not stay long enough in any place for people to write their names on the pews; the order of the services He led was dictated by people's needs & He did not need to look up current illustrations for His messages because He already spoke in daily-life parables. We really need to be inspired by the kind of ministry Jesus led & we need to keep experimenting. We need to get out of our way to reach people even if it meant to change the routine we are used to. Let us dare to take our ministry outside and dare to not aim for surviving but for thriving. Rev. Reine
