PRESBYTERY OF OTTAWA: Chris Clarke, who is our representative to the Ottawa School of Theology and Spirituality, has requested that the appended information about the school's plans for the fall be circulated to all presbyters. The school is celebrating 60 years with a special event on Saturday, September 28 at 3 p.m. The schedule for the period late September to early December outlines those courses on offer this fall. NATIONAL DAY OF TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION: Two years ago, the Dr. Peter Bryce Indigenous Scholarship in Medicine was established by Knox Presbyterian Church (Ottawa) in cooperation with the University of Ottawa's Department of Scholarships and Awards, with the goal of selecting one student applicant annually for an award of \$2000. In the Fall of 2023, the Presbytery of Ottawa endorsed this scholarship with the goal of encouraging congregations and their members to support the project. To date, one scholarship has already been awarded. In order to make this an endowed scholarship, \$60,000 is required and to date we have already accumulated just under half of this amount. All donations can be made directly through the University of Ottawa (see below). With the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation being held again soon on September 30th, this is one good opportunity for inviting people to donate toward a very practical and tangible cause related to our denominational commitments of seeking healing and hope with our indigenous neighbours.
