Minister's Corner: Self-interrogation/self-examination is a process of introspection where we pause to evaluate our thoughts, emotions, behaviors, and motivations. Both science and Christianity emphasize the importance of self-reflection recognizing it as an essential tool for personal growth and emotional well-being. Through self-examination, we gain awareness of our thought patterns, improve emotional regulation, and develop behavioral insight. Such practice fosters self-awareness, emotional intelligence, and resilience, allowing us to live in greater harmony with ourselves and others. From a Christian perspective, self-examination is more than just a tool for self-improvement—it is a deeply spiritual discipline rooted in Scripture, prayer, and repentance. It is about aligning our lives with God's will and growing in holiness. The Bible repeatedly calls us to examine our hearts and motives. As 2Cor 13:5a reminds us, "Examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith; test yourselves." This reflection is not simply an exercise in self-criticism but an invitation to deeper communion with God. Self-examination also leads us to confront our brokenness, allowing God to reveal areas in our lives that need transformation. The psalmist prays in Ps 139 Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting. Through such prayerful reflection, we open our hearts to God's guidance, allowing Him to refine and shape us according to His will. Rev. Reine
