Last issue's answer: 'For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord.... plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. Jeramiah 29:11

Minister's Corner: We all love to have a plan. When facing a big decision—whether it's a job opportunity, a financial investment, or even a vacation—we make sure to have a Plan. And just in case, we also come up with Plan B, C... Parents saving for their child's education, students applying to multiple universities, or professionals networking in case their current job falls through—these are all ways we prepare ourselves for the unknown. But what happens when we run out of plans? When every solution we trusted fails, when the door we counted on closes, we find ourselves saying, I hope this works out... or I hope something changes. In moments like these, hope often becomes our last resort, something we turn to only when we have exhausted every other option. And because our hope is built on uncertainty, it often comes with anxiety, sadness, and fear. Yet, in Romans 15:13, Paul gives us a different vision of hope: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Christian faith calls us to build our lives not on plans that may fail, but on a hope that comes from God—a hope that is alive, certain, and trustworthy. And here's the difference: when our hope is placed in God, it does not come with fear or anxiety but is accompanied by joy and peace. This is a radical shift. Instead of using hope as a last resort, we live in hope every day, knowing that God holds our future. Instead of placing our trust in plans that may fail, we trust in the One who never fails. And instead of being anxious while we wait, we experience the joy and peace that come from knowing that God's plans for us are always good. Hope in Christ is not a desperate wish—it is a firm foundation. It is not an anxious waiting—it is a joyful trust. May we learn to live in that hope today. Rev. Reine
