Minister's Corner: We use our senses to engage life, to encounter different experiences, and to gain a 360-degree understanding of the environment around us. Each sense provides different information which is combined and interpreted by our brain. And it is interesting to realize the different levels of control we have over each one of them. For example, if you go into a food court, three of our senses (sight, smell & sound) will immediately engage us with the 'food experience'. The two other senses are not so. We have more control over the touch and taste senses as we can decide what we want to handle, and more so what we want to taste. Sight, smell & sound will work to tempt us to taste and try, and this is how we end up eating more than what we need! Now, as far as sight is involved, we come equipped with a mechanism to block the light or the picture if we choose to do so. And when it comes to hearing, it is a little trickier to control, but still doable. We have figured many inexpensive ways to manage the noise around us. But smell is very different in that respect. It stands in a category of its own. It is almost the unavoidable sense that engages us with our environment whether we like it or not. Given all of this, and in response to health concerns (like fragrance sensitivities, asthma, allergies) more and more workplaces and public buildings are introducing a scent-free policy. Maintaining good air quality for everyone is certainly both considerate and beneficial. But there is another kind of fragrance that today's world wants to neutralize and make it disappear: It is the verbal and nonverbal truth and meaning that believers communicate and emit in their environment. Whether intentionally or unintentionally, we reflect what we believe in. St. Paul in his second letter to Corinthians puts it this way: "through us spreads in every place the fragrance that comes from knowing Christ. For we are the sweet aroma of Christ" Aroma is the testimony of daily living; it is the weekdays wordless preaching. The aroma of Christ is telling about Christ without necessarily using words. It makes people ask and wonder about the reason behind what they encounter in you. Being the aroma of Christ means being the good news to others before sharing the Good News with them. And taking all this away from the public atmosphere is not a considerate or a good thing to do. Emptying life from spiritual meaning and connection with our creator can't be helpful to anyone. On the contrary it will make people dehydrated, tired, or indifferent at best. May we carry Christ's fragrance everywhere. Rev. Reine
