## Bible Trivia

**Minister's Corner:** We live in a world overflowing with advice. Bookstores brim with self-help manuals. Social media offers endless motivational reels, life hacks, and strategies promising a more efficient, peaceful, or successful life. All of this assumes one thing: that the human being is a project, something to fix and upgrade. In a culture shaped by this mindset, and in a time when biblical focus is often thin, Christianity is easily misunderstood. Faith becomes seen as one more option in the self-help marketplace. Churches risk functioning like wellness centers. Christ becomes a life coach offering inspirational principles for "living better." But if you came to church for advice, you will leave disappointed for Christianity offers something far greater. The biblical witness insists that the heart of our faith is *news*. The Christian message is Good **news**, not good advice. Advice tells you what to do; news tells you what has already been done. Advice aims at self-improvement; news declares a new reality. This is why Paul can say, ***"For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes"*** (Romans 1:16). Notice: the Gospel is not a technique, a strategy, or a set of tips. It is the **power of God**; something God has already accomplished. From the beginning, Christianity centered not on moral instruction but on an event: the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Augustine described this as grace invading the human condition. Luther built his entire theological vision on this distinction: the Law is advice ("Do this and live better"), but the Gospel is news ("Christ has done this so you may live"). Modern psychology agrees: advice rarely transforms anyone. Deep change comes through events: crises, encounters, and stories that reshape our identity. The Gospel offers precisely this: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. This is not advice to improve your life. It is the news that *changes* it. Rev. Reine.
